


Dr. Arens voices role of dentistry in sports medicine

Dentistry's role in sports medicine was addressed by Dr. Donald E. Arens at a symposium on the Development of an International Sports Science Institute held last December in Indianapolis.

Dr. Arens, treasurer of the American Association of Endodontists from Indianapolis, said that "orthopedic physicians, engineers, dentists, and all professionals trained and working in the craniomandibular complex should join together to provide the best treatment for the athlete of today."

He noted that, historically, dentistry has been concerned with prevention of oral injury through use of mouth protectors, and reported on the current investigation into the effectiveness of the mandibular orthodontic repositioning appliance and its effect on athletic per-



More than 400 speakers headline Greater New York Dental Meeting

The 56th annual Greater New York Dental Meeting, which was held Nov 29 to Dec 4 at the New York Hilton Hotel, drew nearly 30,000 persons—including a record attendance of 365 dentists from foreign countries. Final figures showed 12,108 dentists in attendance. Represented for the first

time was the People's Republic of China.

More than 400 speakers and 600 exhibitors presented seminars, clinics, essays, workshops, and displays which included many innovations in keeping with the rapidly changing techniques in diagnosis and delivery

of treatment, according to Dr. Alfred J. Keck, general chairman. Electron microscopy, histochemistry, computerized axial tomography, microem-bolization, office computers, and other sophisticated equipment were shown and discussed.

One of the most important topics discussed by dental professionals was the rapidly escalating costs of gold and silver, Dr. Keck said. Three clinicians reported on the progress made in the development of alloys suitable for dental treatment. They emphasized that while several of the new alloys show promise as alternatives to precious metals, much research remains to be done in order for these alloys to meet today's high standards for good dental care.

A hearing examination was available for dentists and auxiliaries.

Dentistry must put forth a strong and united effort to check any further advances of denturism, Dr. A. Lynn Ryan, ADA Eleventh District trustee, told the 56th annual Greater New York Dental Meeting.

Speaking on "Denturism—what really happened in Oregon?", Dr. Ryan said that "if dentists continue to stay in their little nine-foot by ten-foot 'isolets,' not listening to the needs of the people who pay for their services . . . the dental profession, as we know it, will be viewed in the future as just another interesting phenomenon that fell by the wayside in the natural progression of society."

Military, civilian dentists participate in Army dental conference in Germany

The 24th annual US Army-Europe (USAREUR) and Seventh Army dental training conference in Garmisch, Germany, drew more than 350 military and civilian dentists from the US Army, Navy, and Air Force and from several European forces, making it the largest dental conference in USAREUR history.

The conference theme was "Combat readiness through wartime skills."

Hosted by Brig. Gen. H. Thomas Chandler, deputy commander, Seventh Medical Co., the meeting featured

an address by Maj. Gen. George Kuttas, assistant surgeon general and chief of the Army Dental Corps, who served as chief Army dentist in Europe for three years.

Since 40% of the conference was devoted to dental service in wartime, conference topics included combat readiness, management of combat trauma, management of chemical and maxillofacial casualties, and reconstructive surgery and prosthodontics for the maxillofacial combat casualty.
